THIS TREATMENT IS FREE TO THOSE WHO ARE ELIGIBILE (A POSITIVE TEST OR EXPOSURE TO COVID). THIS EXPOSURE OR POSITIVE TEST SHOULD BE WITHIN 14 DAYS. THE PROCEDURE TAKES 1 ½ TO 2 HOURS. THEIR FLYER IS GOING TO BE POSTED ON THE HEALTH BOARD IN THE MAIN HALL.
