Meeting Date: May 8, 2023

Nancy had surgery Friday and is on 3 powerful antibiotics, she was feeling better, her daughter is here and Nancy is very happy. Betty Mauck doesn't get out much but Bill said if we want to visit to call first and he thinks she will like it.

Lynn gave update on the Sioux Road petitions that were presented to the city engineers.

A speed study of road was done and it showed that 85% of the cars traveled at 38mph. On a residential street it would warrant a speed cushion. But Sioux Road is a thoroughfare and the speed indicates that the speed limit should be raised to 35mph. It will not be raised at this time.

In regards to the stop intersection, they can make improvements such as re-striping and maybe some light improvements. They will start with re-striping.

It also warrants more patrols and activity by the police department.

Lynn asked her the following questions:

Will she follow up with the police, or should she? She said she would but Lynn should also call.

While the general speed is 30mph it is also a school zone, since the drivers are doing about 20mph over the school zone limit shouldn't this be considered? She said that since it is a thoroughfare, they would raise the school zone limit to 30mph.

If the school district had presented the city with the petitions, would it have made a difference? She said no because it is a thoroughfare.

Lynn is going to follow-up with the police and possibly go to a school board meeting to notify parents/students of the findings.

#### JUST A REMINDER!

Here is the information on the city internet again. No updates. Here are some bits of information you need to know.

The city is setting up an internet/wifii for its citizens. The cost is \$25 or \$50 (depending on the speed). (There are some governmental discounts offered, the city staff should know if you're eligible.

You must register with the city. Amigo section residents can do it online at <u>teampharr.net</u>. Tip Residents must call the city offices 956-402-2000. (You need to tell them that you are from the Tip)

There is no fee to sign up but this gets you in line to be installed once they get to our area. For the \$25 or \$50 you get a router, modem and installation (no charge).

Remember this is for Internet/Wifii only. No cable/TV stations come with. You will need to set that up separately.

Lynn made a comment that if we are driving around the park, we can help by picking up things in the road and put them road side in a pile to make it easier for them to be cleared. Also, the empty lots have a lot of debris too.

Marilyn brought up that the air hose is not working by the woodshop. Lynn went after the meeting to file a work order. If you need air Marilyn has an air pump.
