## Juandell Doyle Glass

NORMAN — Juandell Doyle Glass, 77, went to be with the Lord on Wednesday, June 30, 2010. He was born in Lockney, Texas on September 19, 1932, to Doyle and Opal Glass. He married Carolyn Bullock on May 23, 1959 in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

After graduating from Denver City High School, Denver City, Texas in 1950 and West Texas State College, Canyon, Texas in 1954, he attended the University of Texas School of Law, where he graduated in 1960 with a L.L.B. An active member of the U.S. Navy from 1954-1956, he then served in the Naval Reserve from 1956-1979, retiring as a full captain. He served in the IRS Intelligence Division in Texas from 1960-1966 and as an attorney with the Office of Chief Counsel - IRS in Ohio and Oklahoma through July 1989 when he retired. During his years as an attorney with Chief Counsel, he held the distinction of having never lost a case.

Juandell was active in his church life including First Baptist Church Norman where he was a Bible study teacher and served on several committees. A long time volunteer with the Norman Regional Hospital Auxiliary, he was also active with the Matamoros Children's Home in Matamoros, Mexico. He enjoyed reading and traveling and especially time spent at his second home in Pharr, Texas.

He was preceded in death by his parents and brothers, Wendell and Tommy Glass. Left to cherish his memory are his wife and four children: Bill Glass and wife Jan of Atlanta, GA; Ann Tavenner and husband J.D. of Dacono, CO; Karen Meneely and husband Bruce of Kansas City, KS; and Steve Glass of Ozark, MO; four grandchildren: Jon and Jacqueline Glass and Meghan and Samantha Meneely. Also, two step-granddaughters, Dorothy Dick and husband Ron and Trish Tavenner; and three step-great grandchildren: Dallas, Cassidy and Brody.

The family would like to express their gratitude to Dr. Thomas Merrill, Dr. Jeffrey Crook and the wonderful nursing staff at the Norman Regional Hospital Palliative Unit.
