I've had some to ask about my folks...Shorty and Rose Ann Hancock. They are both doing fine. We keep Dad checking in at the doctors for his blood levels and that helps him keep on track. Mom is up walking in the a.m.'s and tending her garden and flowers. Knock on wood....all is well.

I did hear from Warren and Jan Martin:

**Just a quick note to let you know what is happening here in ND. Warren and I have never been in a natural disaster before. Well, we have now! We have been at flood stage for close to a week now. Usually when the spring thaw is over, we are done with those issues. However, not this year.**

**Our region of several states has had unusually high snow and rainfall for several years, and there is 200-600% above average snow pack in Montana and northern Wyoming which is still coming through the Missouri River in Bismarck. The hope is that the melt will be slow. To this point it has been very cool and very little of that snow has been affected as of now. Some parts of Yellowstone Park received 25 feet of snow this winter, and a lot of that area drains into our river system. It is projected the river in Bismarck will stay at or above flood stage most of the summer into mid-August. We are also praying we don't get a major rain event in the 2" or more for several weeks as that would really add to the problem.**

Our home is not in flood danger, the river is about 8 or 9 miles away.....we live about 50' above flood stage. But, there are many who are in the path of the flood that is flowing almost 2 times the speed of Niagara Falls! They said the other day that the flow is over a million gallons of water a second. It is absolutely crazy. We have many friends and relatives who have been dramatically affected by the flood. There have been many days of sand bagging and the National Guard is trying to build strategic dikes, etc. We have a flood family coming to stay with us for this month but so far they are still OK. However, in about a week or so they will make a dramatic increase in the flow up north at Ft. Peck Dam in Montans, so we shall see.
