**Clark Stuart Will (1941-2014)**

Clark Stuart Will was born on a farm near Sterling Nebraska, during a stormy evening on August 30th, 1941. He grew up on that farm, where he took pride in raising his prize-winning hogs. After graduating high school in Adams, he attended the University of Nebraska in Lincoln, where he met his future wife Kathy. Clark and Kathy lived in Iowa, Illinois, and Nebraska before finally settling in Alliance, where he worked for the Burlington Northern Railroad for 21 years. After retirement, they moved to Lincoln, and split time between there and Pharr, Texas. He loved traveling, metal detecting, collecting John Deere toy tractors, yard work, bird watching, and gardening. He was also a 17-year member of AA. He loved his family, and was proud of his two sons and grandchildren.

Clark died Sunday, July 13, 2014 at the age of 72. He is survived by his wife Kathy of Lincoln; sons (spouses) Brad (Mary Ellen) Will of Marriottsville, MD and Matt (Jill) Will of Lincoln; grandchildren Caitlin & Kylie Will; brother (spouse) Keith (Janice) Will of Lincoln and nieces & nephews.
