

TERRE HAUTE – Nancy A. Forsyth, 69, of Terre Haute, passed away at 9:55 a.m. Tuesday, Aug. 5, 2014, at Seton Specialty Hospital, in Indianapolis. She was born in Terre Haute on Oct. 20, 1944, to Max A. Forsyth and Lovella Joers Forsyth. She was a retired school teacher with the Vigo County School Corporation, having taught for 31 years. Nancy was a member of the Indiana Audubon Society, and was very involved with Planned Parenthood of Greater Indiana.
