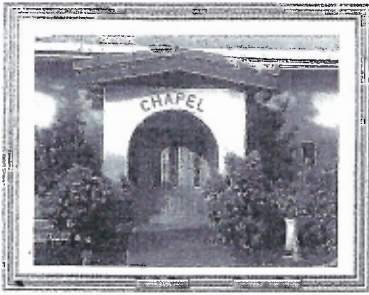

Love is the Most Important Word



One of the most important words used in Scripture is Love. Paul mentions three words in 1 Cor. 13: faith, hope and love, but the greatest of these is Love. Love is what holds people together. Hate tears people apart. In our world today, we are witnessing that Love is losing out.

The two words used in the Bible for Love are “agapao and phileo,” Phileo love is sharing love. It’s a love that demands a favorable response. I phileo you if you phileo me back. Phileo is used in a compound word with money—money-lover; with self—self-lover; and with pleasure—pleasure-lover. This means that there are things in this world that we can phileo more than we agapao God. (1 John 2:15:) Phileo love is an emotional love.

Agapao love is the more important Love. It is an unselfish and sacrificing Love. It’s a Love that does not expect a returning favor. It’s a Love of the will and has the welfare of its recipient in mind. Agapao Love is from God. It’s given to the person who makes a proper response to God’s agapao Love. We love Him because He first loved us.

We see the use of these two loves in John 21:15-17. After Peter’s three denials of Jesus, after Jesus’ resurrection, and after Peter was filled with many doubts of his future, he and the other apostles decided to go fishing, but caught nothing. Jesus stood on the sea shore waiting for the defeated apostles.

Jesus asks Peter if he loved (agapao) Him more than these? And Peter’s response was that Jesus knows that he loves (phileo) Him. Then Jesus gives Peter a command. Then Jesus asks Peter a second time if he loved (agapao) Him. Peter’s second response was that he loved (phileo) Him. Note that Peter could not bring himself to say he (agapao) loved Jesus. Then Jesus asked Peter a third time, Do you love (phileo) me? This disturbed Peter. Jesus seemed to imply He wanted Peter to make sure Jesus was still His friend.

Jesus still trusted Peter to carry out his apostleship because he told him to shepherd His sheep and lambs. Peter certainly showed his agapao Love on the Day of Pentacost and later as he risked his life for Jesus.



25-Mile Club

Those who love (need) to swim laps can become members of the 25-mile Club. In the outdoor pool 44 laps (up and back) is one mile. After completing the 1100 laps (25 miles) you will be awarded a fish dangle to wear on your badge.

Woodshop News

During November, the woodshop is open on a sporadic work session basis because of the absence of monitors. These people open the shop and tool lockers during assigned 3-hour sessions. By December all of the monitors will arrive and will oversee work sessions: 9 A.M. – 12 P.M. and 1 P.M. to 4 P.M. Monday through Friday and 9 – 12 P.M. Saturdays.

The log sheet near the front door should be signed and badges should be worn while working on projects. Lockers for storage of material and tools are available for \$15 a year. There are shelves available to store unfinished projects.

It has been a tradition for everyone to pitch in and clean up the sawdust from the machines and the floor at the end of each work session.

For those new to the shop, monitors and other veteran workers in the shop are always available to answer questions or help with planning and completing projects.

  The Coffee Law - As soon as you sit down to a cup of hot coffee, someone will ask you to do something which will last until the coffee is cold.



   Murphy's Law of Lockers - If there are only 2 people in a locker room, they will have adjacent lockers.

How These Phrases Began

A SHOT OF WHISKEY

In the old west a .45 cartridge for a six-gun cost 12 cents, so did a glass of whiskey. If a cowhand was low on cash he would often give the bartender a cartridge in exchange for a drink. This became known as a "shot" of whiskey.

THE WHOLE NINE YARDS

American fighter planes in WW2 had machine guns that were fed by belt of cartridges. The average plane held belts that were 27 feet (9 yards) long. If the pilot used up all his ammo he was said to have given it the whole 9 yards!

BUYING THE FARM

This is synonymous with dying. During WWI soldiers were given life insurance policies worth \$5,000. This was about the price of an average farm, so if you died you "bought the farm" for your survivors.

RIFF RAFF

The Mississippi River was the main way of traveling from north to south. Riverboats carried passengers and freight but they were expensive so most people used rafts. Everything had the right of way over rafts which were considered cheap. The steering oar on the rafts was called a "riff" and this transposed into riff-raff, meaning low class.

COBWEB

The Old English word for "spider" was "cob".
