



FOOD HANDLERS' COURSE

The State of Texas, starting this year, has decided that all the parks serving meals for any occasion have to abide by this ruling. Anyone, whether preparing or serving food (even packaged), will now have to take a course in food handling. This is a two hour course and can be taken online, OR at the Extension Office at 410 N. 13th Ave. in Edinburg on the 3rd Thursday of every month starting at 6:00 p.m. (call in advance), OR the Activity Office will try to get a mass class in our park. Your certificate will be good for two years. The cost of the course is \$20.00 (\$9.99 if taken online at https:// www.foodhandlercardonline.com) and will be paid for by the Activity Department.

If you are interested in a mass class, there will be a signup sheet on the board - please print your name as this is what the instructor will use to create your certificate.

How to read Bar Codes interesting!

This may be useful to know when grocery shopping, if it's a concern to you.

GREAT WAY TO "BUY USA & CANADA" AND NOT FROM CHINA!!

The whole world is concerned about China-made "black hearted goods". Can you differentiate which one is made in Taiwan or China?

If the first 3 digits of the barcode are <u>690 691 or 692</u>, the product is <u>MADE IN CHINA</u>. 471 is Made in Taiwan.

This is our right to know, but the government and related departments never educate the public, therefore we have to research it ourselves.

Nowadays, Chinese businessmen know that consumers do not prefer products "MADE IN CHINA", so they don't show from which country they are made.

However, you may now refer to the barcode - remember if the first 3 digits are:

690-692 ... then it is MADE IN CHINA

00 - 09 .. USA & CANADA

30 - 37 FRANCE

40 - 44 GERMANY

471 ... Taiwan

49 ... JAPAN

50 ... UK

ARTS AND CRAFTS SHOW





Tomb of the Unknown Soldier

- 1. How many steps does the guard take during his walk across the tomb of the Unknowns and why?
- 21 steps. It alludes to the twenty-one gun salute, which is the highest honor given any military or foreign dignitary.
- 2. How long does he hesitate after his about face to begin his return walk and why?
- 21 seconds for the same reason as answer number 1
- 3. Why are his gloves wet?

His gloves are moistened to prevent his losing his grip on the rifle.

4. Does he carry his rifle on the same shoulder all the time and if not, why not?

He carries the rifle on the shoulder away from the tomb.

After his march across the path, he executes an about face and moves the rifle to the outside shoulder.

5. How often are the guards changed?

Guards are changed every thirty minutes, twenty-four hours a day, 365 days a year.

6. What are the physical traits of the guard limited to?

For a person to apply for guard duty at the tomb, he must be between 5' 10' and 6' 2' tall and his waist size cannot exceed 30.' Other requirements of the Guard:

They must commit 2 years of life to guard the tomb, live in a barracks under the tomb, and cannot drink any alcohol on or off duty for the rest of their lives.

They cannot swear in public for the rest of their lives and cannot disgrace the uniform {fighting} or the tomb in any way. After two years, the guard is given a wreath pin that is worn on their lapel signifying they served as guard of the tomb. There are only 400 presently worn.

The guard must obey these rules for the rest of their lives or give up the wreath pin.

The shoes are specially made with very thick soles to keep the heat and cold from their feet. There are metal heel plates that extend to the top of the shoe in order to make the loud click as they come to a halt.

There are no wrinkles, folds or lint on the uniform.

Guards dress for duty in front of a full-length mirror.

The first six months of duty a guard cannot talk to anyone, nor watch TV.

All off duty time is spent studying the 175 notable people laid to rest in Arlington National Cemetery. A guard must memorize who they are and where they are interred.

Among the notables are: President Taft, Joe E. Lewis {the boxer} and Medal of Honor winner Audie Murphy, {the most decorated soldier of WWII} of Hollywood fame.

Every guard spends five hours a day getting his uniforms ready for guard duty.


ETERNAL REST GRANT THEM O LORD, AND LET PERPETUAL LIGHT SHINE UPON THEM.

In 2003 as Hurricane Isabelle was approaching Washington , DC , our US Senate/House took 2 days off with anticipation of the storm. On the ABC evening news, it was reported that because of the dangers from the hurricane, the military members assigned the duty of guarding the

Tomb of the Unknown Soldier were given permission to suspend the assignment.

They respectfully declined the offer, 'No way, Sir!' Soaked to the skin, marching in the pelting rain of a tropical storm, they said that guarding the Tomb was not just an assignment, it was the highest honor that can be afforded to a service person.

The tomb has been patrolled continuously, 24/7, since 1930.







TV CORNER—GREAT INFORMATION!

The below summary took a lot of time to put together and should save everyone money when it comes to all the new technology available today when it comes to getting the channels you would like to have on your TV.

ALTERNATIVES TO SATELLITE AND CABLE

Here's a look into to the brave new world of live TV streaming over the Internet. Two necessary steps are: Have a good Internet connection and get a streaming device that enables you to download applications (apps)_
STREAMING DEVICES

ROKU, FIRESTICK, CHROMECAST, APPLE TV, NVIDA SHIELD. And dozens of other sticks and boxes. A SMART TV will also be ok, the older ones sometimes only come with preinstalled apps and new ones cannot be added. A streaming device will make a regular TV into a smart TV. Next on your list would be a provider, they will stream content to you. Good news is that most will offer a free trial period so you can see if it's right for you. Most will offer a monthly plan. Make a list of the channels you want and then check out their service. Don't cancel your cable or satellite before you try some out. Generally no contracts.

Some things you might look for when trying their services:

Selection of channels

Price

Do they carry locals (not to important if you have an antenna)_

Some don't have sports_

Video quality

How many connections, this determines how many TV's can be hooked up_

DVR service (recording) and how many hours are allowed_

Sometimes a combination of two services are better.

Cordcuttersnews.com/plays gives a chart that shows channels, devices etc. Also later we will list some of the best free streaming services.

THE DEVICES

ROKU, AMAZON FIRE, APPLE TV. CHROMECAST,

Let's just look at the 2 main streaming devices .ROKU is the number one device for streaming from the Internet in the US it has 41 million devices and 50% of the market. It's good for those new to streaming media. User interface is time tested and content is robust and easy to search. This device allows you to watch free and paid video content on your TV. It comes with pre-installed apps such as Netflix, Amazon, Hulu etc. It has access to thousands of channels. There are 8 streaming devices, 5 boxes and 2 sticks and just added a sound bar with a Roku built in . Also many new TV's now come with Roku installed. Connected by a hdmi cable to the TV. The sticks plugs directly into the back of the TV. Priced from \$30 to \$100. Need to have an account with Roku. It always stays in a stand-by mode, only one model can be powered off. Has a voice assistant. No web browser at this time AMAZON FIRE

All streaming devices basically do the same thing. It has 30% of the market, where its different is that it can stream 3rd party apps which gives it more options which makes it more cutting edge. These 3rd party apps can be very useful but unreliable, The problem is when an issue arises you have to know how to fix it. But regular apps and Amazon Video work fine. Alexa is included. Priced from \$30 to \$100. An account is also required. It has a web browser.

APPLE TV is favored by people who are in the mac world. Expensive at around \$180.

CHROMECAST from Google is at a disadvantage because it comes with no remote and works with a smart phone. Starts at around \$35.

STREAMING PROVIDERS

Some of the providers that can stream content to you are:

NETFLIX / AMAZON PRIME / HULU TV LIVE / YOUTUBE TV / PHILO / SLING PLAYSTATION VUE / DISNEY PLUS / DIRECTV NOW (they are in the process of splitting up their channel packaging). We will give more details on these later.

If you're in the market for a new TV you might want to consider getting one that has a streaming device built in. Roku and Firestick are in many TVs now. This is a very changing scene with new streaming devices and the providers trying new features. Prices for players range from \$30 to over \$100. Streaming providers' prices depend on their packages, but start from \$20 to \$80. Coming from cable and satellite it's not the most user-friendly experience, a learning curve is necessary.

NETFLIX

Provides ad free movies and TV shows. Has a free 1 month trial.

BASIC PLAN SD Standard Definition 1 stream \$9

STANARD PLAN HD High Definition 2 streams \$13

PREMIUM PLAN 4K Ultra Definition 4 streams \$16_

You can share the account with others. (not with Basic that only has 1 stream)

Data usage is lower with Standard Definition. Can download TV and movies to watch later.

AMAZON PRIME

\$119 annually. Also a monthly plan and a 30 day free trial. You can subscribe to a standalone video membership for \$9 a month. Included in the regular membership is the video streaming, music, fast shipping, free audio books, some Kindle e-books, also you can subscribe to premium pay channels like HBO, STARZ, SPORTS etc. _

HULU and HULU LIVE TV from Disney_

BASIC PLAN \$6 month, On Demand TV and movies. HULU LIVE TV \$45 month. Includes Basic and 65 live channels. Basic plan without ads \$12 month. Hulu live TV without ads \$51 month. Can subscribe to premium channels, DVR (recording) is available. Music service available for \$5 month Two streams with Hulu Live TV. Locals depend on what city you live in. Free trial is 1 month. Streaming on more than 1 device is extra.

YOUTUBE TV from Google_

\$50 month, this gives you a mix of 70 live TV, video on demand, DVR features.

YouTube Premium is a \$12 ad free music service. On both you can have 6 accounts, 3 streams at a time. 7day free trial. Entering your zip code lets you know what channels, locals, sports, news are available in your area. Tells you what devices you can run to watch the service. Unlimited DVR which is kept for 9 months, each account has its own DVR.

Affordable live TV, no sports, no locals, 58 channels for \$20. Can sign up for a free 7-day trial without a credit card, just a phone number. Unlimited DVR recording. Saves for 30 days. 3 streams, 3 devices at the same time. Chrome or Firefox can be used to open the app. Search for it with a Firestick. Has a guide. Able to set the resolution for playing, Auto, High, Low. Has search feature. No on demand TV shows, just live TV. Used a lot in combination with other services.

SLING TV from Dish Network

Has 3 plans: SLING ORANGE is \$20 a month, has 30 channels, 1 stream at a time.

SLING BLUE is \$25 has 45 channels with 3 streams. SLING ORANGE AND BLUE is \$40 and has 4 streams. Can get premium chs. like HBO, extra sports. Orange package does not get locals. DVR costs \$5 for 50 hours. Has on-demand content but limited to the past 3 to 5 days. Has a guide. 7 day free trial.

PLAYSTATION VUE from Sony

Packages are: ACCESS \$50 a month has 45 channels. CORE \$55 gets access plus NFL, NBA, MLB, core plus some movie channels. ULTRA \$85 gets elite plus premium chs. like HBO etc. 90 chs. available. Enter Zip code to see what chs. are available in your area. 5 streams at one time on every plan, watch on 3 devices. All plans provide unlimited DVR recording and storage for 28 days. Can fast forward through commercials on most chs. Limited On-Demand content for TV and movies. Has a guide. 7 day free trial.

Will be available in Nov. \$7 a month. A package that includes DISNEY + HULU and ESPN is \$13 a month. Can stream on 4 devices at the same time.

FUBO TV

Starts at \$55 a month. A sports centered service. Offers RSN (regional sports networks) no ESPN. Includes some local channels.

SOME OF THE BEST FREE STREAMING SERVICES

PLUTO TV, THE ROKU CHANNEL, TUBI TV, XUMO TV, CRACKLE TV, IMDb, STIRR, NEWSON. Some examples of what they offer:

PLUTO TV has 200 channels, can be viewed on over 14 platforms including Roku, Amazon and some smart TV's. Less ads than regular TV. Its organized into categories such as news, sports, comedy, gaming, entertainment, music, radio and more.

THE ROKU CHANNEL on the Roku device has movie and TV channels, news, sports is ad supported, can be viewed on Samsung TV's.

TUBI TV, CRACKLE, XUMO TV, has 160 channels, IMDb is an Amazon service for Fire devices, they all have about the same format.

NEWSON and STIRR are apps that give you local stations throughout the US. _

DVR OPTIONS (recording)

For those who like to record there are two categories. One that can record from OTA (over the air) and recording from an Internet streaming service. AMAZON FIRE TV RECAST is a OTA device (\$230) has 2 tuners, 500GB, 75 hours of storage, can add external storage, also comes with a 4 tuners. Works best with other Amazon devices. Not able to record from cable or satellite or streaming apps. Has a guide. TABLO, TIVO, CHANNEL MASTER are other OTA devices. Most streaming providers have DVR included in their service, but each one has their own rules._

SUMMING UP

If you are comfortable with cable and satellite and the price is not a burden then it might be just as well to stick with it. Streaming seems to be the future but it's still going to see lots of changes before it settles down. You also have to take into account the cost of Internet service which varies a lot. If you would like to see more on how these devices work we can probably set up a demonstration.
